CAST BIOS

PITER MAREK – ROBERT

Piter Marek, born in the Middle East, grew up in New York where he lives today. Marek's acting credits include a leading role in the TNT television series, THE GRID (opposite Juliana Marguiles and Dylan McDermott) as well as work on LAW & ORDER, THE EDUCATION OF MAX BICKFORD, THE CHAPPELLE SHOW, and THE LATE SHOW WITH DAVID LETTERMAN. Piter has also worked with the Sundance Lab and the REFUSE AND RESIST NETWORK ON IMAGINE: IRAQ, a series of plays exploring connections between the people of Iraq, the Middle East, and the West, as well as Second Stage Theater, DESTI: NATION AMERICA plays surrounding experiences in Immigrating to America.

Hailing from the beautiful Shenandoah Valley in Virginia, Niabi Caldwell has been acting since the age of twelve. Since appearing in FACE VALUE she has starred in two other independent films and has also worked on Sydney Pollack's THE INTERPRETER and Kenneth Lonergan's (YOU CAN COUNT ON ME) latest feature film, MARGARET starring Anna Paquin and Matt Damon. Upon her arrival to New York City, Niabi worked as a knife thrower's assistant and formed an all female scooter club. Niabi currently resides in Brooklyn, New York with her two cats Obie and Ethie.

CREW BIOS

JAMES ISRAEL AND JEFF ISRAEL – DIRECTORS

James Israel and Jeff Israel are Brooklyn based filmmakers originally from South Carolina. Their collaborations include short films and feature length screenplays.

They recently completed their latest short film, FACE VALUE, which is about a lonely office worker from another country that becomes entranced by a seductive barfly.

Their short film THE TOURIST, starring musician and actress Rebecca Moore had its world premiere at the 2005 South by Southwest Film Festival and also screened at the Woodstock Film Festival and the Hamptons International Film Festival. It is available on the DVD anthology The Journal of Short Film.

Their first film, BACK AND FORTH, screened around the country, including the Atlanta Film Festival and a giant outdoor video screen in Times Square.

Other shorts include: TERRAIN VAGUE, which screened at the Atlanta Film Festival and the Raindance Film Festival; and THE SINKING SHIP, a short film based on the Staten Island segment of their feature length screenplay, FIVE BOROUGHS.

They are currently in development on a feature length project, THAT WOMAN, which is about a middle-aged woman who has an inappropriate relationship with a teenage boy, threatening her brother's run for the gubernatorial race.

More about JAMES ISRAEL – WRITER/DIRECTOR

James has written for indieWIRE and The Independent Film & Video Monthly and is currently a staff member at indieWIRE. James has worked with their daily Park City coverage for the past six years at the Sundance Film Festival. He was previously a staff member at the Association of Independent Video and Filmmakers. He has also acted as a script reader for Global Film Initiative, the IFP Gordon Parks Awards, and has screened films for The Tribeca Film Festival.

More about JEFF ISRAEL – DIRECTOR/EDITOR

For the past eight years Jeff has worked on features films, documentaries, television series, commercials, and short films. His post-production credits include: READING RAINBOW for PBS, LITTLE BILL, an animated series created by Bill Cosby for Nickelodeon/CBS, various reality television programming for BBC Productions USA, IN MEMORIAM, an HBO documentary covering the events of September 11, 2001 in New York City, and the independent feature film LOGGERHEADS, which screened in the Dramatic Competition at the 2005 Sundance Film Festival and was distributed theatrically by Strand Releasing. He is currently working on the ABC comedy, THE KNIGHTS OF PROSPERITY.

CAITLIN MIA CASSARO – PRODUCER

Caitlin Mia Cassaro began her producing career on the music side, producing DVDs, music videos and profiles for artists such as Norah Jones, Amos Lee and Al Green. Caitlin has worked as UPM on numerous shorts including QUEJIOS, a short film produced by Krush Productions and PING PONG LOVE, directed by Bo Mehrad. She has also produced (and written) THIRSTY, directed by Bo Mehrad and produced the recently completed FACE VALUE, directed by James Israel and Jeff Israel.

Caitlin received her MBA in Media Management from Metropolitan College of New York, graduating first in her class. She began her career in entertainment with EMI Recorded Music where she developed and maintained first the production department, and later the international marketing department for EMI's Angel and Blue Note Records. She left EMI to join New Video Group as the acquisitions and marketing director for the company's dedicated documentary label, Docurama. She has also worked with the Tribeca Film Festival as their dedicated industry liaison and for the IFP Market.

Caitlin continues to work on a variety of short films, as well as commercial, and video projects. She recently line produced a Madeline Peyroux music video (Rounder Records) for Flip Productions, and has completed numerous industrial/commercial projects for New York based production company, Beaucoup Chapeaux. She is currently in pre-production on a documentary about the lovely insanity of being a new parent in New York City.

AMANDA DOSS – PRODUCER

Amanda Doss has been working in independent film for almost a decade. She is a founding partner of Ugly Betty Productions, Inc. which was established in order to pool talented filmmakers to produce marketable, entertaining and stimulating independent films.

Through Ugly Betty Productions Amanda has produced the feature film, CLOSER THAN THE BOY NEXT DOOR as well as several short films, commercials and music videos. Individually, Amanda has worked as Line Producer and UPM on many features including Sarah Jacobson's 1997 Sundance entry, MARY JANE'S NOT A VIRGIN ANYMORE. She has also produced dozens of nationally aired commercials and industrial films; her work includes pieces for Universal Pictures, Procter & Gamble and Mercedes-Benz to name a few.

Aside from producing, Amanda is the founder of The Producer's Action Network (PAN), a workshop series geared toward helping producers network, exchange ideas and develop their film projects. She has served as Marketing Coordinator for IFP/New York, has taught producing workshops at DCTV, and has moderated and coordinated Master Class Workshops for AIVF. Currently Amanda teaches producing at the New York Film Academy.

Amanda recently completed two other short films; THIRSTY, directed by Bo Mehrad, LUCKY, directed by Melissa Berman, DONUT HEAVEN, directed by Annetta Marion. She is currently working on several other projects with her partner, Director Bo Mehrad.

MATTHEW D. HALE - DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Matthew D. Hale graduated from the film program at University of Florida and moved to New York to and worked as a crew member on feature films, music videos, commercials, and television. Over the course of eight years Matthew honed his skills on projects like BOYS DON'T CRY and ALL THE REAL GIRLS with acclaimed cinematographers Jim Denault and Tim Orr. Matthew has also headed up the lighting department for music videos for Interpol, Death Cab for Cutie, and Taking Back Sunday as well as commercials for Canon, Discovery Times, Westminster Dog Show and many others. He now builds his own shooting career, working on a myriad of projects including short comedy, dramatic narrative, and commercials while utilizing the full spectrum of digital and film formats. His latest dramatic project was shot in 24P High Definition for Jeff and James Israel entitled FACE VALUE.

LAURIE KRUPP – PRODUCTION DESIGNER

Since 1997 Laurie Krupp has art directed and production designed more than 30 independent films, and recently finished production on a feature called DAY ZERO starring Elijah Wood, Chris Klein, Ally Sheedy and Ginnifer Goodwyn.
